

More Monday Softball action

GAINESVILLE — Coming into Monday night's Livingston Conference matchup between unbeaten Warsaw and Letchworth, both sides had been riding momentum garnered from early-season victories, which included some quality play up and down each team's entire lineup. To put it plainly, these two teams were rolling coming into this game, but only one would be able to keep the unbeaten train going at night's end.

That team turned out to be the Warsaw Lady Tigers, who rode an incredible pitching performance from senior Anna O'Geen to an 8-0 victory. O'Geen struck out 11 Letchworth batters over a complete game of work, during which she gave up only two hits.

"As a whole we played very well defensively and Anna threw well in the circle," said Warsaw head coach Amber Stackhouse. "We had a great defensive outing, and we executed at the plate."

O'Geen also recorded a fine day with the bat, finishing 3-for-4 with a triple and two runs scored. Lizzy Standera was the leader at the plate for Warsaw, recording a four-hit day, which included a run scored. Leah O'Geen went 3-for-5 with a run scored, Savannah Till finished with a hit and two runs scored and Nicole Till recorded two hits and two runs scored.

"I think we executed our small ball very well, and then we hit a few shots when they were necessary," continued Coach Stackhouse.

Warsaw plays again tomorrow but then will be forced to endure a lengthy break.

"After our game tomorrow we're off until (April) 22nd," said Stackhouse. "It's unfortunate, but we'll get some good reps in during that time and get ready to come full-force after the break. This is a good group that stays focused, and they really want that (sectional) block at the end of the season."

For Letchworth in what was a disappointing defeat, Allison Karasiewicz and Gabi Goodrich each finished with a base hit and were the only two players to record a hit for the Indians, who fell to 1-1.

Warsaw improved to 2-0 with the win.
