HORNELL — After putting up seven runs in their first at bat down in the Maple City, and then proceeding to watch Hornell tack on a 10-spot in the bottom of the second, Cal-Mum head coach Dan Dickens saw his youthful Lady Raiders show some resiliency.

Cal-Mum improved to 2-0 on the season as they scored multi runs in every inning but the third during their 23-17 victory over host Hornell Monday night.

Cal-Mum's offense was crushing the ball as three players had at least three hits.

Leading the way was Taylor Mills who went 3-for-4 with four RBIs and three runs scored while MacKenzie Stetzenmeyer was 3-for-4 with four runs scored and three RBIs. Sawyer Richardson also got into the act as she went 3-for-5 with a triple, three runs scored and two RBIs while Haley Sherwood and Lizzy Pies scored three runs each.

Winning pitcher Maddy Devore helped her own cause at the plate going 2-for-5 with four RBIs, three runs and three stolen bases.

In the circle, Devore struck out eight batters however she ran into some control issues in the second and Richardson came in and did a nice job to get Cal-Mum out of that and also pitched the third before Devore went back to finish things up.

"We're happy to get the win and the girls showed some resilience especially Maddy coming back in more composed the second time around," coach Dickens said. "The bottom of the order made things

happen on offense Richardson, Stetzenmeyer, Pies and Mills. We have a big game with York (Tuesday) so just going to run with the positives and fix the mistakes on the fly.”
