Section V softball: Top tournament seeds, standout hitters and a memorable championship

The School of the Arts and East High softball teams were anxious to play in the league championship game at St. John Fisher College.

When those plans fell through, the Rochester City Athletic Conference final appeared to be headed back to Cobbs Hill.

Yet, RCAC coaches and representatives were adamant in giving the girls a unique experience.

So in the 11th hour, school officials, including SOTA athletic director Dave Michaelson and East superintendent Shaun Nelms, worked diligently with St. John Fisher to secure the college softball field for Wednesday.

Their persistence was successful and the result was a captivating, high-scoring RCAC championship game. SOTA defeated East 16-6 Wednesday night at SJF.

"I love all the support we get at East for athletics, and for the girls to experience this, which is like no other," Vann said.

SOTA senior **Natalie Buzzell** was named MVP after going 4-for-4 with four RBIs. Her Silver Hawks had a six-run second inning that gave them a comfortable lead the rest of the

way.

"It's our game not there's. We were going to do our best no matter what," SOTA's sophomore second baseman Amiei Hall said.

Wednesday marked the first time an RCAC final was played SJF. Well over 100 spectators passed through. The city final used to be played at Monroe Community College and in recent years it's been hosted at Cobbs Hills or the higher seed.

The coaches and the girls just wanted something a little extra special. Coaches wanted to play in a memorable final.

"It gives everybody else in the city a drive," said Diaz, whose Silver Hawks won their third straight RCAC title. "That's the goal, 'Let's play at Fisher.' ... Our joy as coaches is to see them come out on the field, throw their gloves, and have that background be here."

'On to the next'

Buzzell was the easy choice for MVP.

She was perfect at the plate and her defense at shortstop was just as impressive. She sparked a 6-3-5 double play with **Keira Ackley** and **Ada Reddington** in the third.

"Not only this team, but this program has come a really long way, and we're only going up right now," Buzzell said. "Definitely just proud of where we are, ready to keep moving forward. That's like our mantra, 'On to the next!""

Hall made the all-tournament team after going 3-for-4 with two doubles and two RBIs from the leadoff spot.

Pitcher **Shannon Conner**'s effective inside pitch helped her strikeout six batters to make the all-tourney team. COVID sidelined her midseason, and she wasn't the same when she returned. Diaz thanked his "awesome" assistant coach for helping Conner return to normal.

"I think I can speak for all three of us when I say the relationship we have together is the best I've ever experienced on a team before," Conner said.

Catcher Ella French and pitcher Johelys Alicea made the all-tourney team for East.

The Eagles (6-10) didn't go out without a fight, picking up "small wins", like their three-run third inning to get within 8-4.

The season isn't quite over, but Vann said her seniors French, **Karlie Shelley**, **Alexis Scott**, will be missed. Scott, who joined team this season, smacked an RBI-double despite being nervous to pinch hit. **Jessica Conrow** and **Taiasia Gibson** played well at the top of the lineup and and are expected to step up even more next season.

"We're definitely going to miss the seniors, but we have a lot of potential coming up," Vann said.

French, who will study at the University of Rochester on a full academic scholarship, thanked Vann for being an "amazing coach" throughout her five-year varsity career.

"I'm proud that we kept the energy up the whole game. We didn't get down or quiet. I'm very proud of them for that," French said.

Pittsford celebrates softball

"They still remember what it's like to play little league and how important it is to grow the game," Jake Lyons, vice president of PLL softball, said. "We have great coaches like Scott Parson and (Mike) Scialo who are invested in keeping this sport alive."

Anna Bello homers again

Anna Bello hit her third homer in the regular season finale.

She's come a long way since her first varsity season in 2021.

"Last year I hit two. This year I'm at three and I hope to keep progressing," said Bello, who drives in her twin sister, Emma, on most of her RBIs.

Assistant coach Stephanie Zimmerman witnessed Anna Bello's growth firsthand.

"She's more confident now," Zimmerman said. "She feels she can be a leader on and off the field."

Maddie Hicks, who hit her first homer of the year May 12, made it sound easy to collect extra base hits.

"I just clear my mind and try to help the team out," she said.

Mary Marrapese typically bats in the middle of the lineup. She said the entire team can hit.

"My batting average is representative of our team as a whole. Our team can hit consistently all throughout the lineup," Marrapese said.

Thomas (15-5) enters the postseason on a three-game winning streak, thanks to strong defense and pitcher Rose Nicastro's strong play.

"She wanted to establish herself, and that's what she did. We're happy to hand her the ball," coach Emily Castro said.

"I like going into it blind, and telling the team about the pitches," Bengsch said.

"Everybody can hit. Everyone is running through the bases as fast as possible."

Churchville-Chili (2-17) has had tough breaks with a young team.

After a couple wins and some close losses, the future is bright with sophomores Grace Stella and Alexa Briggs.

Stella has been hitting well with multiple different bats.

"I've changed my bats for different pitchers. That seems to be working," Stella said.

Briggs is the leadoff hitter, working walks to get on base. Stella typically bats her home.

"I like having Grace backing me up. It's motivating. She's good at hitting lines drives, so I can score easier," Briggs said.

With two eighth-grade pitchers and another one at first, coach Brian Briggs is optimistic of the future with Stella and Briggs leading the way.

"We were counting on them to be cornerstones for us this year," coach Briggs said.
